

JOE BIDEN - TOO OLD FOR PRESIDENCY?

Is Joe Biden really too old to be the next president of the United States of America? To be able to answer this question we have to get to know him first.



Joseph Robinette Biden Jr. was born on November 20th 1942 in Scranton, Pennsylvania as the son of Catherine Eugenia Finnegan Biden and Joseph Robinette Biden Sr.. He was the oldest of four siblings and was raised in a Catholic family. Biden attended St. Pauls elementary school in Scranton until he and his family moved to Claymont, Delaware in 1953. As a young boy Biden struggled with a stutter which he eventually overcame by memorizing poetries and reciting them before a mirror. Biden attended the Archmere Academy in Claymont, which he called "the object of my deepest desire, my Oz". He had a long dream of attending the academy but his parents were not able to afford tuition, so Biden had to work at the school by washing the windows and weeding the garden to get accepted.

At Archmere, Biden was an academically poor student but a standout athlete. He was the halfback and the wide receiver on the school's football team and he played on the baseball team as well. Joe was considered a natural leader among his classmates and he got elected class president during his junior and senior years. He graduated from Archmere in 1961. Biden enrolled at the nearby University of Delaware after Archmere, where he double majored in history and political science. During his junior year at university Biden took a spring break trip to the Bahamas where he first saw his future wife, Neilia Hunter, who was a student at Syracuse University at the time.

Joe Biden - too old for presidency?

After his graduation from Delaware University in 1965 Biden applied to Syracuse Law School to be closer to Neilia, where he earned his Jurisprudence Doctor degree. Biden and Hunter married in 1966 with whom he later had three children; Joseph Robinette "Beau" III (born in 1969), Hunter (born in 1970) and Naomi (born in 1971). He graduated law school in 1968 whereafter he moved to Wilmington, Delaware, to begin practicing at a law firm and working as a public defender. In 1970 he became an active member of the Democratic Party and was elected New Castle County Council

On November 7th 1972, when Biden was 29 years old, he was elected into the US Senate as one of the youngest senators. A few weeks later, on December 18th 1972 Biden lost his wife Neilia Hunter and his one-year-old daughter Naomi in a tragic auto accident. Both of his sons were seriously injured in the accident, so he took his senate oath in January 1973 in the hospital, at the bedside of his sons. Biden served as the US senator from 1972 to 2009. During his time in the senate he called for action to address climate change and protect the environment even before it was a mainstream issue and he addressed the problem of violence against women, which at that time was still considered a "family issue". Joe married his second wife, Jill Tracy Jacobs, then an English teacher, in 1977 whereafter they completed their family with their daughter Ashley Biden, who was born in 1981.

Barack Obama announced Joe as his vicepresidential running mate on August 22nd 2008 at his speech in Springfield, Illinois.

On January 20, 2009, Obama was sworn in as the U.S. president and Biden became the 47th vice president. In 2015 tragedy struck the Biden family again, when Beau Biden, Attorney General of Delaware, passed away due to brain cancer. On January 12, 2017, President Obama awarded Biden with the Presidential Medal of Freedom with distinction, the nation's highest civilian honor, in a surprise ceremony at the White House. Obama called Biden "the best vice president America's ever had".



Joe Biden - too old for presidency?

On March 29th 2019 Lucy Flores, a former Nevada state assembly woman, published an essay ("an akward kiss changed how I saw Joe Biden"), in which she described him touching her inappropriately and kissing her on the head during a Democratic campaign rally in 2014.

Biden apologized by saying: "I recall countless handshakes, hugs, expressions of affection, support and comfort," adding,

"And not once — never — did I believe I acted inappropriately. If it is suggested I did so, I will listen respectfully. But it was never my intention."

A few days later Amy Lappos came forward with her story of how Biden once made her uncomfortable at a fundraiser. Biden publicly apologized and distanced himself successfully from these accusations.

On April 25th of last year Biden announced his candidacy for presidency by representing the democratic party.

On August 11, 2020, Biden announced Kamala Harris as his vice presidential running mate. "I have the great honor to announce that I've picked Kamala Harris — a fearless fighter for the little guy, and one of the country's finest public servants — as my running mate," he said. Biden's approach to defeat the coronavirus is to provide free testing for everyone and to set up a national contact-tracing programme. Biden's vision for America is about rebuilding the working middle class and this time by making sure everybody comes along—regardless of race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, or disability. He says that he wants to establish at least 10 testing centres in every state and he wants all governors to mandate wearing masks. He also wants to extend loans to small businesses and increase direct money payments to families.

Joe Biden - too old for presidency?

Biden wants to raise the federal minimum wage to 15 dollars per hour and he also wants to invest 300 billion dollars in US-made materials, services, research and technology.

He believes that racial injustice does exist in the US and must be dealt with through broad economic and social programmes to support minorities and he calls for a 300million-dollar investment into a community policing programme.

Joe has called climate change an existential threat, and says he will rally the rest of the world to act more quickly on curbing emissions by re-joining the Paris Climate Accord and he also says that he will expand the public health insurance scheme, the Obamacare.

Now that we know a lot more about Biden we can finally answer the question; *Is Biden too old to be president?*

Joe Biden would be the oldest president in history which wouldn't make him a bad president in any way. Joe is hard-working, responsible and ambitious. One thing we know for sure; Joe Biden would make a way better president than Mr Donald Trump who has failed to deal with a global pandemic and is incapable of supporting minorities in any way.

Donald Trump has a complete lack of empathy whilst Biden is caring and decent. Biden's courage and his integrity make him a good leader and would make him a good president. According to a survey of the PEW research center, economy is the top issue for voters in the 2020 election (79% registered voters said that economy is very important to their vote), followed by health care.

Personality does not matter that much but I believe that, after the last four years of Donald Trump as the president, positive personality traits will make a difference but personality alone will probably not be as much of a deciding factor.

Does the US President have too much power?

Did you know that the political system of the United States of America is divided in the same way as the German system?

The US Constitution is divided into the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Branch. The judicial branch is led by the US Supreme Court, which can declare governmental actions as unconstitutional. The US Supreme Court is the main court in the USA. All the other courts have to follow its decisions. All states have state courts of their own, though.

The legislative branch is led by the US Congress, which is divided into the US and the US House Senate of Representatives.

The US Senate consists of two senators per state, regardless of population and size.

The senators are elected through vote in their state every six years.

The official vice president the representative chief of the US Senate. Each state elects representatives for the House of Representatives every two years. The number of representatives is based on the population.

The executive branch is led by the this position president. In he can recommend laws to the US Congress.

He is the head of the US Federal Government and the chief of state, the ceremonial head of the government.

As chief executive he has the "executive power" and as chief administrator he is the director of the executive. Basically, he controls himself in his job as leader of the executive because he is the chief of party and with this the leader of the political party that controls the executive.

He is expected to be the representative of all US American citizens as the chief citizen.

He is the chief architect for the country's foreign policy and the spokesperson to the rest of the world as chief diplomat.

Besides, he is also the main architect of nations public policies. In this function he is called commander legislator.

One of his main jobs in the executive is that he has direct control over the entire military as the commander in chief, but he is not allowed to declare wars. In his role head of government he is the responsible for appointing people to be head of government departments, when they are confirmed by the senate and in the care of the national emergency he can call the congress back into session during a break. As head of state he is commander in chief, negotiates and signs treaties with other countries together with the senate, is in charge of diplomatic relations with other countries (chief diplomat) and has the power to pardon anyone convicted of a crime.

As can you see the president has many powers, more than ours has. So there's a reason, why he is called the most powerful man of the USA. In my opinion the many powers he possesses can be risky, even though there are different branches. What is your opinion?


