Jerry - Something you should read!

During the last two months my class and I read "Jerry" by Laurence Harger and Cecile Rossant. But in my blog this is not the only topic. I want to talk about the reading of books in lessons and about the difference between books and the texts out of textbooks. In my opinion reading books is one of the best things you can do.

Firstly I will tell you what I like and dislike about reading books in English lessons. I like to read books in lessons because it is more interesting than working the whole time in the workbook and the textbook. But I think it is boring to only read books because you have to learn and to go on with the learning matter of the school year. So it is only a nice change. It has other advantages like the different tasks which can be given by the teacher. So you have the chance to work more with the book. Sometimes you can understand the book better because you have the chance to write a part of the book out of another perspective or think

You can really learn English because there is a short dictionary in the back of the book. I think you can identify with the characters and follow their actions. But I don't like that the texts do not really tell much about the persons you are reading about. You don't have the chance to identify or understand what they are doing. It is very short and sometimes very boring because in the textbooks are similar tasks to do. One big advantage is that in the textbook there are many different kinds of stories. There is for example one dialogue, one article and to blogs. So everybody can choose what they want to read.

Finally I can only say that reading books is so much fun and it doesn't matter where you do it. It is only important that you love to read and it is very good idea to read "Jerry".
